2 Intellectual Property

2.1 IP policy

- ENUMERATE logo and branding materials;
- ENUMERATE communications collateral (e.g. leaflets, posters, and flyers);
- Published web content.

Institutional and personal data

- No personal data, acquired by the project’s activities, will be published by the project. It will be stored by during the lifetime of the project for administrative and communication purposes.
- No institution names and address data, acquired by the project’s activities, will be published by the project. The aim is to prevent individual organisations being identified from the information
- No comments by respondents that could be used to identify them will be published.

This permits the widest possible range of uses by 3rd parties across the broadest possible spectrum of legislatures (including those outside the EU).
